

Call for Artifacts and Other Historical Documents Pertaining to Turkey Creek / Turkey Creek Nature Preserve

Should you have artifacts, photographs, books, journals, recordings, newspaper clippings, etc... of interest to the Turkey Creek Nature Preserve, please call the Preserve Office at (205) 680-4116, or email Taylor Steele, Preserve Manager at tsteele@bsc.edu. If no one is available to take your call, please leave a message with your name and phone number. Also state the purpose of your call so that that we may contact you. As always, we thank you for taking time to contact us and for sharing what you have with others.

Please use the following procedure for all potential donations to the preserve. We must follow this procedure in order to maintain the integrity, authenticity, and safety of any artifact before officially accepting it into our collections.

- Submit all potential loans, donations in writing or call to make arrangements with Preserve Manager.
- Describe the object, including any numbers, markings, manufacturers' names, and the measurements.
- Write a brief statement about how the object was acquired and the owner's intention to either donate or loan to Turkey Creek Nature Preserve.
- Include a photograph or photocopy of the object with your letter.

Once Turkey Creek Nature Preserve receives your written proposal, a tracking number will be given to the artifact. If artifact(s) are accepted we will contact you in order to make arrangements for delivery.

This process may take a couple of weeks. Again, thank you for your interest and patience.
