The Pinson City Council met in regular session at Pinson City Hall at 4410 Main Street, Pinson, on Thursday, February 21, 2023. Councilor Roberts led the invocation. Councilor Walker led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Mayor Cochran recognized Loxcille Tuck, the long time Mayor of Tarrant, passed away last week. Mayor Cochran mentioned the cities thoughts are with her family.

Mayor Cochran appointed Councilor Roberts to chair.

Councilor Walker offered a Resolution for Aniyah Griffin in recognition of winning the first Girls Alabama State Wrestling Title for the 2023 season for Pinson Valley High School. Councilor Irvin duly seconded the motion. Councilor Roberts called for a roll call vote with the following results: Councilor Irvin- yes, Councilor Walker- yes, Councilor Roberts- yes, Councilor Kirkland- yes, Mayor Cochran- yes. Councilor Roberts, "let the record reflect that passes as Resolution 23-06."

Committee Chair Reports:

Highlights on the bills included Lockcorp in the amount of \$5,000.00, Tyler Technologies in the amount of \$2,000.00, Best Insurance Group in the amount of \$40,000.00, and Borland Benefield in the amount of \$23,000.00. Councilor Roberts called for all in favor say 'aye', all opposed say 'no'. **Councilor Roberts, "let the record reflect the 'ayes' carry unanimously."**

Enhancements: Councilor Kirkland announced Trade Days will take place on March 4, 2023, from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.

Councilor Irvin announced City Fest will take place on April 29, 2023. Councilor Irvin also mentioned that two or three food trucks have been invited.

Councilor Roberts suspended rules.

Councilor Roberts, "let the record reflect unanimous consent passes." Councilor Roberts called for a roll call vote for on the main Ordinance with the following results: Councilor Irvin- yes, Councilor Walker- yes, Councilor Roberts- yes, Councilor Kirkland- yes, Mayor Cochran- yes. Councilor Roberts, "let the record reflect that passes as Ordinance 2023-05."

Mayor's Report: Councilor Roberts announced the Shred a Thon will take place on March 25, 2023, June 17, 2023, and October 21, 2023, from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m.

<u>New Business:</u> Councilor Roberts offered the first reading of a Resolution changing the name of a street regarding Bicentennial Park. Council members mentioned renaming the street to Bicentennial Drive.

Councilor Walker offered a motion to approve to provide funding for the TAASRO Conference for two of the SRO officers in the amount of \$5,0004.00. Councilor Irvin duly seconded the motion. Councilor Roberts called for all in favor say 'aye', all opposed say 'no'. Councilor Roberts, "let the record reflect the 'ayes' carry unanimously."

Councilor Kirkland offered a motion to approve the replacement of windows at City Hall in the amount of \$13,880.00. Councilor Walker duly seconded the motion. Councilor Roberts called for

all in favor say 'aye', all opposed say 'no'. Councilor Roberts, "let the record reflect the 'ayes' carry unanimously."

Councilor Kirkland offered a motion to approve the purchase of radar signs for each end of Main Street in the amount of \$8,290.00 as well as \$500.00 for the posts. Mayor Cochran duly seconded the motion. Councilor Roberts called for all in favor say 'aye', all opposed say 'no'.

Councilor Roberts brought up a conversation about Waste Management. He mentioned the previous conversation that was had at a previous council meeting when Mayor Cochran requested a refund to the citizen for the lack of service they received. Councilor Roberts mentioned he had not seen the refund on his invoice, so he called the local number. He also mentioned that when he called the customer service was friendly and was able to get him a partial refund for the services he did not receive. Councilor Roberts encouraged all citizens to call the customer service number listed on the invoice to request a refund.
