

Council Minutes
April 4, 2024
Regular Meeting

The Pinson City Council met in regular session at Pinson City Hall at 4410 Main Street, Pinson, on Thursday, April 4, 2024. Councilor Roberts led the invocation. Councilor Walker led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Minutes: Councilor Kirkland offered a motion to waive the reading of and approve the minutes from March 21, 2024. Councilor Walker duly seconded the motion. Mayor Pro Tem Roberts called for all in favor say 'aye', all opposed say 'no'. **Mayor Pro Tem Roberts, "Let the record reflect the 'ayes' carry unanimously."**

Committee Chair Reports:

Finance: Councilor Irvin offered a motion to approve the bills in the amount of \$277,657.83. Councilor Churchwell duly seconded the motion. Highlights of the bills paid auditors \$27,000.00, Renovation at the Rock School \$100,000.00, EMA \$10,000.00, IT \$5,000.00, Deputies \$30,000.00 Insurance 53,000.00 Fireworks Deposit \$6,000.00. Mayor Pro Tem Roberts called for all in favor say 'aye', all opposed say 'no'. **Mayor Pro Tem Roberts, "Let the record reflect the 'ayes' carry unanimously."**
